




It's family game night. What is your first choice? 11-point pitch. But we are a game family, so I'll play any game, except Monopoly, because my husband is ruthless.





#### Frontenac City Clerk Receives 2024 Outstanding City Clerk Award

Frontenac City Clerk, Leesa Ross, was presented with the prestigious Missouri City Clerks and Finance Officers Association's 2024 Outstanding City Clerk Award at the annual MoCCFOA Spring Institute banquet held in Columbia, Missouri on March 13, 2024. The purpose of the Outstanding City Clerk Award is to recognize a city clerk or finance officer who has demonstrated outstanding service and commitment to their municipality, community and professional organization.

JoAnn Cova, City Clerk of the City of Maryland Heights, submitted a nomination application for Leesa that was reviewed with seven other nominations for this year's Outstanding City Clerk Award. A five-member panel of judges, including the Kansas CCFOA President, the Illinois CCFOA President, a Missouri Municipal League representative, and two prior recipients of the award voted to bestow this honor upon Leesa.

To achieve the recognition of Outstanding City Clerk is an honor not achieved by many and is a testament to her extraordinary dedication to the City of Frontenac and to the MoCCFOA members.

Leesa is a member of the Eastern Division of MoCCFOA. She has served in all executive positions on both the State Executive Board and the Eastern Division Board. She has attended and presented at Spring Institutes, Regional Conferences, and has chaired and served on nearly all state and division committees over the last 20+ years. She is currently serving on the Executive Board for Region VII of the International Association of Municipal Clerks (IIMC), representing clerks in Missouri, Illinois and Kansas. The IIMC Board represents over 14,900 members. She is a member of the Host Committee for the IIMC 2025 Conference which will be held in St. Louis, Missouri. Leesa has also served on the IIMC Mentoring and Membership Committee and is currently serving as a liaison on the committee, assigned by the Current IIMC President. She has been with the City of Frontenac for almost 24 years.

Leesa has earned the highest designations in both MOCCFOA and IIMC. Leesa obtained her Master Municipal Clerk designation from IIMC in 2011 and her Missouri Professional City Clerk designation from MOCCFOA in 2014. She holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Public Policy Administration from the University of Missouri St. Louis.

Additional contributions Leesa has made to her city and community include overseeing the annual Frontenac Festival, which the city hosts for the community. Leesa also started a weekly enewsletter, which is sent out weekly to the residents of Frontenac, consisting of events, acknowledgements, and upcoming meetings which are held in and around Frontenac. Leesa is responsible for coordinating the annual holiday party for all staff, elected officials, and families where employees are recognized for their time of service with the city. Also, Leesa served on the Use Tax Committee for the City of Maryland Heights, where she resides.

The MoCCFOA is a professional organization of municipal clerks and finance officers who have united together to assist members in the performance of their job responsibilities and promote the professional development of its members for the betterment of the public and municipalities they serve. A healthy recipe to go along with our Health Nut Theme





### NO BAKE ENERGY BARS

- 1/4 cup honey
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1tsp vanilla
- ¼ tsp salt
- 1 cup quick cooking old fashioned oats
- ½ cup unsweetened coconut (substitute dark chocolate chips if preferred)
- ¾ cup coarsely chopped dried cherries
- ½ cup creamy peanut butter

Stir together the first 4 ingredients with 3 tablespoons hot water until smooth. Stir in oats and coconut: let sit for 10 minutes. Fold in cherries and peanut butter. Scoop by tablespoons and roll into balls. Place on rimmed baking sheet and chill for at least 30 minutes.






